According to Ms. Hutchison, the general idea to her creations is to use a fusible web such as Steam A Seam 2-Lite to attach her fiber pieces to her background. Additionally, she uses parchment paper to "build" her creations because after fusing the pieces together on the parchment, it is easy to peel the entire piece off the parchment and place it on the background

fabric exactly where you want it. Other suggestions from Ms. Hutchison include: Use a

variety of multi colored fabrics because it is very hard to make a collage with solid fabrics, use fabrics of the same color but different patterns, use embellishments often and use charm packs for lots of color/patterns for the small pieces in the quilts. She enjoys using Cherrywood, Tula Pink and Kaffe fabrics due to the vibrant colors and patterns. She suggested watching the videos of Laura Heine, Emily Taylor and Susan Carlson for knowledge, inspiration and patterns.


Retreat

It will feature Dawn Filson, (from Cottontail Quilts in Kennesaw, Ga), demonstrating how to make a fun "zippered box" bag project (**The Easy Does It Bag**). Cost to attend is \$25.00. A supply list is as follows: #3 fat quarters (Main Bag, Lining, Coordinating fabrics), 18" x 21" Soft and Stable (By Annies), 8" x 6" fusible interfacing, By Annie's handbag zipper 15" or larger (the 30" zipper will be enough for 2 bags), sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, matching thread, marking pen, rotary cutter, favorite quilting rulers, small cutting mat, stiletto-optional.
- O Prior to attending class, be sure to cut the Main Bag Fabric (to be quilted) 18" x 21", cut the lining fabric 18" x 21", and coordinating fabric into *Bias Binding 14" x 14" and *2 handles 4" x 5 3/4"
